Mr. Anderson's law enforcement career began 40 years ago as a Forensic Chemist with the New York State Police after obtaining his master's degree in forensics, working mainly toxicology and drug chemistry. He has served as a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation handling general crimes, foreign counterintelligence, drug investigations, and international terrorism. He also served in the same position with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), Office of Investigation, working investigations involving fraud, abuse, and corruption regarding entities regulated by the NRC. Finally, he served as a Special Agent for the DOJ/OIG investigating allegations of fraud, abuse, corruption, or waste in federal agencies falling under the DOJ. These matters, as was the case at the NRC could be criminal or administrative in nature.

Additionally, he has served as a Deputy Inspector General and Director of Internal Audit in the New York State Office of the Inspector General assigned to the Division of Military and Naval Affairs and other state agencies. Prior to this, he was assigned as a Confidential Investigator to the state IG office with responsibilities in all state agencies. He has also worked as a Director of Security in the corporate sector involved with supervising staff and executing programs within that entity.
